
Methodology

- Random telephone interviews conducted with registered voters throughout the state of Georgia
- 659 interviews completed between December 13 and December 15,
 2007
- Data weighted for age, race, gender and political party affiliation
- Maximum sampling error is +/- 3.7%





Satisfaction with Georgia Public Schools





Desired Authority to Approve Charter Schools


