

The five-year school scholarship program is scheduled to expire after the school year ending in June 2010 and the families who currently receive the scholarship will lose these funds.

Many, if not all of the children currently receiving scholarships will be forced to go to failing DC public schools, 86 percent of which do not meet adequate yearly progress goals.

Save Opportunity is a cause to allow a small percentage of students to be granted the "opportunity" to access a wider range of schools that can give them a different perspective.

It gives us a chance to measure the differences these kinds of programs can make and to better value both our public and private school communities.


Throughout the summer months, Save Opportunity's "Knock for Opportunity" program will be canvassing Metro stops, fairs, festivals and farmers markets around DC.



"I strongly urge the Committee to pass a reauthorization

bill for the OSP. It is not enough to fund only the current children while not accepting new applications. That decision would split up families, could force the closure of some schools, and seems to be made based on political compromise rather than on the facts. It will be difficult to administer this program on a scale smaller than the current size. Participating schools will face higher per capital compliance burdens as the number of students dwindle. Moreover, it sends a mixed message to parents regarding the program's future and the certainty that their children can continue their educational path uninterrupted."





Dear Dr. Kingsley:

On behalf of the leadership of the education reform movement nationwide, we are writing to ask for your help — to ensure that our nation's leaders receive a clear message about a critical, successful education program in the nation's capital that without your intervention, faces extinction.

It is called the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program, and has been an overwhelming success—with students demonstrating advanced achievement and with parents posting high levels of satisfaction. The program lets low-income and middle class parents select the best schools for their children—public or private. The program was passed five years ago with bipartisan support—now, even though it is limited to just 2,000 children, each and every one of its participants is making a positive impact on their families and communities.

Why does this matter to you? Because while Congress is spending billions in stimulus money for other programs (and some that don't work) this one small, \$14 million program actually educates poor children and ensures your tax dollars are working to help them become productive citizens. But some Members of Congress and their special interest friends are working overtime to kill the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program. We need your help to make sure that this program—and the future of education reform in America—stays on the right track.

Across the country, 5 million children are confined to 10,000 failing schools. We are writing to ask that you send a message—either through a letter, e-mail, or phone call—to Senator Warner that we must reform education in our nation's capital—and in Virginia.

On July 30, 2009, a bipartisan coalition led by Senators Joe Lieberman (I-CT) and Susan Collins (R-ME) introduced a bill that would reauthorize and strengthen the D.C. school choice program. <u>But some leaders in both Houses of Congress are on record against the program's continuation</u>.

Without your intervention, Dora,—and without the immediate support of Senator Warner—this successful endeavor faces extinction. This program is working to extend better opportunities to children who need our support the most.

Tips on Communicating with Congress

- 1.) On Capitol Hill, letters are still the preferred choice of correspondence. But phone and email can be just as effective to ensure your voice is heard.
- 2.) Personalize your letter. Use the sample provided only as a guide to ensure the key points are made.
- 3.) Be sure to stay on point. You should address only one issue in each letter and it should be only one page in length.

SAMPLE LETTER TO CONGRESS

I'm writing to let you know that I support the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program (OSP) and ask that you vote to support the full reauthorization of the program.

Created by Congress in 2002, the OSP provides school choice for low-income families to pick schools that meet their children's needs best in the nation's capital. I am a resident and voter in [insert state] who strongly believes Congressional support and approval of this program is a MUST especially in our nation's capital where 86 percent of its children are in failing schools.

I believe it is insufficient to only allow current students to graduate or to simply include just their siblings. I strongly endorse the full reauthorization of this program for future generations of students.

I am committed to the change for America our elected leaders in Washington envision. That vision MUST include the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program.
