CONGRESS LOOKS AT CHARTER SCHOOLS Tours of D.C. Schools Brings Focus on Charter Contributions

(Washington, DC 5/2/2000) Capping off National Charter Schools Week, on Friday, May 5, 2000, a Congressional delegation will arrive via school bus to tour two of the District's Charter Schools. This congressional tour will bring onto the national stage the focus of Charter Schools achievements and activities.

The purpose of the Congressional Salute to Charter Schools, organized by CER, is to bolster the visibility of charter schools and highlight the activities taking place around the country under the leadership of state charter school resource centers in nearly every state.

The School for Arts in Learning and Hospitality Public Charter School will open their doors to Honorary Co-Chairs of the Congressional Salute to Charter Schools – Reps. Tim Roemer and Peter Hoekstra – as well as any others from the delegation and members of the press.
