HOWARD FULLER RECEIVES COMMENDATION AS NATION'S UNSUNG EDUCATION REFORM HERO

Mr. Fuller is former Superintendant of the Milwaukee Public School District. He has been a champion of reform before reform was a headline issue and has spiritedly engaged parents and educators alike to get more involved in their children's education.
