STATEMENT BY JEANNE ALLEN, PRESIDENT OF THE CENTER FOR EDUCATION REFORM ON THE SELECTION OF THE U.S. SECRETARY OF EDUCATION

(Washington, DC 12/29/00) On the appointment by President-elect George W. Bush of Houston Independent School District Superintendent Rod Paige to be Secretary of Education we offer our support and assistance in bringing about much needed change and reform to America's schools.

The Center for Education Reform has noted in the past that Rod Paige is one of those unique local leaders who puts children ahead of conventional wisdom. During his tenure, he has raised the bar for all children, drawing praise from reformers and local union officials alike.
